Welcome The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you. **And also with you.**

Lighting of the Advent Candle

We are lighting the Advent candles, praying that our preparation for Christmas may help us to look outward in love, and to look forward in hope.

Risen Christ, Light of the world, shine in our lives and shine among us now.

Let us pray that waiting for Christmas may show us how to be patient when things take time, how to live for Christ day by day, and how to wait for promises not yet fulfilled.

**Thanks be to the Advent God, who comes among us,

Gracious God, your vision of peace and wholeness comes to us in sweeping
revelations and in tiny signs of hope. Kindle our hearts, that we might be
a hopeful people. Keep us from growing weary of waiting so that we
do not miss the glory of your appearing. Even so, come quickly, O God. Amen.
